# St. Mary's Church 2024 Highlights

#### December 2023:

- At the Annual Parish Meeting on December 3, Roxanne Marshburn and Daniel LeClair concluded their terms on the Vestry. Danny Buck and Kim Davies were elected to fill the two positions.
- The Christmas Luncheon was held on Sunday December 10 and was attended by 32 parishioners.

### January:

- At its meeting on January 10, the vestry elected Jim Hayes as Sr. Warden and Karl Hammers as Jr. Warden. They also appointed George Francis as Treasurer, Pam Anthony as Clerk of the Vestry, and Daniel LeClair as the parish Webmaster.
